



The Global Business Practices to Improve the Human Condition (GBP) minor is open to all university students with a GPA of at least 2.0.

To complete the Global Business Practices to Improve the Human Condition minor, students must pass the 21 credits of required and elective classes listed below with an average of a 2.5 in these courses. Students must complete at least 6 out of the 21 credits at the 3000-4000 level. No course grade may be lower than C- to earn the minor. Additionally, students must complete an approved experience with a social or economic change component approved by Pamplin International Programs. The minor will be noted on the student's transcript.
